Honoring Veterans



Parkway Schools held a Veteran's Day Assembly on Friday, November 11, to honor our local veterans. As the veterans arrived, they were greeted by the FFA Chapter with Carnations and a handwritten note of appreciation for their service.

The program began with Parkway High School's Student Government presenting the color guard as they marched around the gym to the cadence played by Aaliyah Baxter. Each military flag was carried by a student government representative including Meg Henkle, Ruby Bennett, Breanna Berry, Paige Stephenson, Paige Williamson, Avery White, Audrey Nichols, Francesca Steinbrenner, and Taylor Minnich.

The elementary students then stood to sing, "America, Land of the Free" by Roger Emerson, and "The Spirit of America" written by John Jacobson and Cristi Miller. After the elementary sang, middle school House Council representatives including Maggie Rich, Jackson Ross, Cami Langenkamp, Wyatt Pancake, Jaymin Peel, Piper Pennell, Alicia Miller, and Bailey Menchhofer read various speeches. Fifth graders Landyn Heiser, Meadow Hays, and Lydia Gibbons read acrostic poems, while sixth graders Kayli Ford and Hadley Stover shared their essays. The seventh grade House Council members wrote a Thank You letter that was shared by Albany Roth. Then to end the speeches, the eighth grade House Council students collaborated to write an essay explaining "What Freedom Means to Me." The essay was shared by Morgan Louth. Finally, the middle school student body sang "Proud to be an American" by Lee Greenwood.

To continue the Veteran's Day celebration, high school FFA Vice-President, Allison Hughes introduced United States Representative, Bob Latta, who gave a patriotic speech about the meaning of Veteran's Day. Allison then introduced the veterans by name, military branch, years that he/she served, and wars/conflicts/deployments that he/she served in. Allison also named family members in attendance and Parkway students who were related to the honorary veterans. The high school band ended the Veteran's Day assembly by playing the military medley, "Salute to the Armed Forces" arranged by Dennis Reaser. The song transitioned from the Navy to the Army, then the Air Force, and finally to the Marine Hymn. Each veteran proudly stood when his/her military branch song was played.

Parkway had a record number of veterans attend this year, with 54 in total honored. Parkway Local Schools and our communities would like to thank our veterans for their service to our country. Parkway Panthers are proud to be Americans.

FFA National Convention

In late October, fourteen of Parkway's FFA members attended National Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. Part of the trip consisted of touring area businesses including, J&M Manufacturing in Fort Recovery, Ohio. Then they traveled over to Indiana to tour many different agricultural places including Poet Bioprocessing in Alexandria, Albanese Candy Factory in Merrillville, Fair Oaks Farms in Fair Oaks, and RDM Aquaculture Shrimp Farm in Fowler, Indiana.

After a few days of touring, the FFA members wore their official dress and attended the National Convention opening ceremony. Over the next two days, the members experienced many different speakers such as the National Officer team; the Keynote speakers, Tamika Catchings and Coty Back; and they enjoyed listening to the State FFA Band and Chorus. Between sessions, members had the opportunity to walk through the Expo Center where there were many colleges, businesses, and organizations present.

For the first time in Parkway FFA history, Senior Carter Hellwarth represented Ohio at the National level in the Prepared Public Speaking Competition CDE. Carter wrote and memorized a 6-8 minute agricultural-related speech entitled, "Victory Gardens." Afterwards, Carter was asked several questions about his speech topic, where he was judged on his knowledge of content and his ability to answer questions thoroughly. Congratulations to Carter for all of his hard work.
