


Special Education Family Survey

Kindergarten Registration

Parkway Elementary will be holding their Kindergarten Screening on March 21 and 22 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Students need to be five years old before August 1 to be eligible to attend. Parents or guardians requesting open enrollment for their kindergarten student to Parkway Local Schools should also register at this time. If your child is new to Parkway Local Schools, the following should be brought to the school on the day of screening: the official birth certificate, social security card, immunization records, one form of proof of residency and any court documents pertaining to the custody/guardianship of the student (divorce, foster, etc.) The birth certificate is from the Department of Vital Statistics (if born in Ohio, from any Ohio county health department) where a fee will be charged. The hospital complimentary birth certificate will not be accepted. Immunizations are required to be documented by the 15th day of school for the 2024-2025 school year. Appointments may be set by calling Michelle in the elementary office at 419-363-3045 ext. 720 to register your child for a screening time.
